WRITING CONTEST RULES & INFORMATION

Contestants are encouraged to submit an original poem or short story with a Halloween theme. There is a limit of one entry per contestant. The contest is open to Irvington residents of all ages. Winners will be invited to read their masterpiece at a recorded session which will be shared on the Irvington Halloween Festival Website. Winner notifications and invitations to read their stories will be sent on October 20th, 2020.

General Contest Rules & Guidelines

- Limit of one entry per contestant
- Entries must be e-mailed to **irvspookystory@gmail.com** no later than <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>October</u> <u>13th</u>. Late entries will not be considered
- Entries must be appropriate for general audiences. Any entry deemed inappropriate or that fails
 to meet the contest criteria outlined may be disqualified at the discretion of the contest
 coordinator or judges
- Entries cannot have been previously published
- Entries must be emailed in a <u>fully editable</u> file format (i.e. Microsoft Word, OpenOffice, Rich Text)
- Entries **must** include the following details within the document:
 - o Title
 - o Author's First and Last Name
 - o Author's Category (Grade in school or 'Adult' if not applicable)
 - o Name of School (if applicable)
 - o Author's Home Address
 - o Author's Phone Number (or parent's)
 - o Author's Email Address (or parent's)

Contest judges will select the best short stories and poems based on scariness, theme, originality, entertainment value, and writing quality. There will be a winner selected within each of four age group categories. Categories are: *Adult, High School, Middle School and Elementary School.*

Poems can be of any length. The poem does not need to rhyme or fit any specific poetic form.

A **short story** can be a personal narrative, memoir, true story or any kind of fiction story. We will consider stories that are between 800 and 15,000 words in length; please do not send anything longer or shorter than this. Judging will emphasize writing quality rather than length. Contestants may include illustrations to enhance the storytelling. Works must be submitted in an editable format. Any illustrations must be submitted in a separate file that is attached to the email.
